President's Report for year ended 30th June, 1977.

It gives me pleasure to present the President's Report for the year ended 30th June, 1977.

Following the pattern of previous years, we have met on twelve occasions since our last annual meeting. At these gatherings, we had the opportunity to further our knowledge by listening to guest speakers, many of whom showed slides to illustrate their address.

Outings were arranged by our Social Secretary and many members availed themselves of the opportunity to visit places of interest. For some years now, a three day trip has been organised over the Eight Hour week-end and on this last occasion members toured the Western Districts. It is pleasing, and also very encouraging, to be able to report that these outings proved popular, and on several occasions, we were unable to accommodate all those wishing to participate.

Of course, the highlight of this past year was the organised visit of 34 of our members to Norfolk Island. This was a most ambitious project and the response which we received was overwhelming. I'm sure there are few Societies who could obtain the support which we received, and which, from all reports, resulted in an interesting and enjoyable nine days at this old settlement.

Our Society has now been in existence for sixteen years and membership stands at 236. We may take pride in the attendances at our meetings and I think there are few Societies of any type which could match our figures.

At our August meeting, 92 people were present, In April - 90, and for the full twelve months, the average attendance was 75. This reveals a steady growth, the figures for the previous three years reading backwards being 69, 60 and 55.

Members were recently supplied with a copy of the Lydham Hall Local Committee's Annual Report and will have noted the progress made with our Museum. The existence of Lydham Hall is now well known and it is proving popular with visitors, a fact highlighted by the attendance for April this year, when 149 adults and 329 children visited the house.

Our financial strength is revealed by the Treasurer's statement at the June meeting when we had \$2,700 in hand.

May I once again pay tribute to those members whose efforts make the very existence of our Society possible - the Office Bearers, and those on the ladies' Fund Raising Committee, Lydham Hall Roster and the Supper Roster.

At this time, I would particularly like to mention Mrs. Eardley who has been Secretary of the Society for a total of six years and has indicated that she now wishes to step down. Her contribution to the Society's success has been large indeed, and even now she is willing to continue to assist with the Bulletin. On your behalf, I record our deep appreciation for the help and untiring efforts of Mrs. Eardley.

I have now been an Office bearer for thirteen years - four as Treasurer and nine as President - and feel a change would be good both for the Society and myself.

I trust there will be other members willing to continue the work of the Society by standing for these two positions at the election of officers.

In June 1961 a small group of people, 12 in number and mainly Aldermen and Officers of the Rockdale Municipal Council, met in the Council Chamber and thus was formed the Rockdale Historical Society with the object of researching and recording the history of the locality and supportive of the preservation of suitable buildings, furniture, items of manufacture and commerce, and old domestic relics and artifacts of interest within the district.

The following year in August, the group changes its name to the St. George Historical Society to broaden the geographical scope of historical objectives to embrace the whole of St. George District from Cooks River in the north to Georges River in the south, with particular attention to historic Botany Bay and its association with Captain Cook and the planting of the British Union Flag on Terra Australis more than 200 years ago.

Since that small beginning the fifteen years have seen the St. George Historical Society grow to a membership of more than 250 persons, and during those years they have organised a variety of inspections and tours of sites of historical interest within the district and beyond, often extending to week-ends in the country.

The Society's monthly journal has recorded a wealth of historical facts, stories and anecdotes, with sometimes note a little legend, which may otherwise have well been lost for all time, as many of the elders in the community who personally related their reminiscences have since crossed the Great Divide themselves.

A number of small publications have from time to time been produced by the Society, so ably written and illustrated by a late esteemed member, under the following titles.....

Some are currently available at \$1.00 each, plus postage, and provide some indication of the extent of the Society's activities and interests.

Not least of the St. George Historical Society's functions is the operation and maintenance of a local history museum in "Lydham Hall" an early home located in Lydham Avenue Bexley. The house was erected in 1855 on the highest ridge of land between Cooks River and Georges River, and was built

of locally quarried sandstone in the architectural style transitory from the Georgian to the mid-Victorian colonial eras. Originally named "Lydham", this historic old home later became "Lydham Hill" and prior to World War I assumed its present name of "Lydham Hall".

Following 115 years of varied ownership, "Lydham Hall" was purchased by Rockdale Municipal Council in 1970 with the express objective of preserving one of the oldest dwellings still existing between the Rivers, and it has been the Council's patronage and support which has enabled the St. George Historical Society to establish a quality museum containing a fine range of colonial furniture dating from the 1860's and mostly on loan from the National Trust, along with a surprising variety of glassware, china, silverware, decorative ornaments, clothing, household items, books, photographs, etc. "Lydham Hall" is certainly well worth a visit and is open to the public on Saturdays, Sundays and Public Holidays from 2.00 to 4.00 in the afternoons, and mid-week group bookings by arrangement with the Curator. It is of interest that during the last year some 2,600 people inspected "Lydham Hall".
