
Guest Speaker: Anne Field

LYDHAM HALL HISTORIC HOUSE AND MUSEUM | UPDATE

It has been a very busy 6 weeks since we received the keys to Lydham Hall and the amazing team of volunteers have been working very hard to achieve as much as possible in a very short amount of time.

Despite a 3 month delay in finalising the License Agreement, coupled with delays in gaining access to the museum, we had hoped we could partly open the museum in October. Alas we have realised this target date was too optimistic.

Instead, the Society Executive has decided that it would be preferable to present the museum as finished as possible, with all rooms open and completed. As such the reopening has been postponed to February 2024 - a date chosen because it marks the anniversary of the museums opening in February 1971.

In the meantime, cleaning and setting up the displays continues. As at the time of writing, most of the downstairs rooms have been cleaned and we are started to place furniture inside the rooms. This has meant lots of waxing and polishing. Easy work for domestic servants from days gone by but hard work for modern muscles. Next step is making the rooms looked lived in - Victorian style!

We have also set up our new local history room and will soon commence the final room - the old 1917 kitchen. Outside, windows and shutters have been washed and we have started painting the garden furniture.

This little painting is probably one of the most important pieces in our collection. It is a painting done by Ellen Davis, wife of Joseph Davis - the man who built Lydham Hall in the late 1800's. The painting is of a French rural scene painted in 1887 by Ellen as a gift to her son. It now takes pride of place on the wall in the Drawing Room. Sadly the painting and the frame is in need of conservation and the Society will be looking at raising funds to achieve this.



Thanks to our Treasurer, Barry, the Local History Room is set up with a new desk, chair and two new modern display cases. This room will hold a permanent exhibition about the St George district with information panels on the walls and objects of local significance. A good example of an object of local significance is the small chair in the corner of this room. It was the first Mayoral chair, used by Mayor James Beehag on the 13th January 1871 when he was elected the first Mayor of the newly formed West Botany Municipality (later renamed the Municipality of Rockdale on the 17th May 1888). The museum is extremely lucky to have had this chair donated by local man, Mr Edward Fripp, in 1992.

Our volunteers have worked tirelessly to get Lydham Hall back into shape and they all deserve special mention. Volunteering at the museum is rewarding and fun work and we have enjoyed some great lunchtime discussions sitting on the back verandah. 

WOODFORD ACADEMY, WOODFORD NSW






